## Exhibit Highlights

**Vibrant multimedia** and Hollywood memorabilia. **Stunning photography** of Eva Snoijink from the Netherlands: Select photos from her book, *Down’s Upside: A Positive View of Down’s Syndrome*, are on display. **Kelly’s Hollywood**, an inspirational documentary about a young woman who has Down syndrome and her brother’s quest to fulfill her dream of becoming a Hollywood diva, is available to view as part of the exhibit. **The “Unspoken Voice” artwork exhibition** showcases Bailey Bastine, an artist from East Aurora, NY who has Down syndrome.
